Marked by wisdom or judiciousness (prudent advice)

Shrewd in the management of practical affairs (*prudent investors*)

Marked by circumspection (discreet)

"Sometimes it is better to say nothing at all than to say anything. That shows prudence, so the wise thing to do under certain circumstances could be to keep our mouths shut, especially if we're in trouble, and the only prudent thing to say might be, "I'm sorry." Someone who is being prudent is careful or wise in handling practical matters and is exercising good judgment or common sense. That is basically what being prudent is."
